



In February 2026, compared to the same month of the previous year; exports increased by 1.6 % to 21 billion 65 million dollars, imports increased by 6.1 % to 30 billion 271 million dollars. In the January - February period of 2026, compared to the same period of the previous year, exports decreased by 1.2% to 41 billion 380 million dollars, and imports increased by 3.1% to 58 billion 966 million dollars.

In February 2026, compared to the same month of the previous year;

- Exports increased by 1.6 % to 21 billion 65 million dollars,
- Imports increased by 6.1 % to 30 billion 271 million dollars,
- Foreign trade volume increased by 4,2% to 51 billion 336 million dollars.

In the January - February period of 2026, compared to the same period of the previous year;

- Exports decreased by 1,2% to 41 billion 380 million dollars,
- Imports increased by 3.1% to 58 billion 966 million dollars,
- Foreign trade volume increased by 1.3% to 100 billion 346 million dollars.

In February 2026, compared to the same month of the previous year;

- The ratio of exports to imports decreased by 3.1 points to 69.6%,
- Excluding energy data, the ratio of exports to imports decreased by 5.9 points to 80.4 %,
- Excluding gold and energy data, the ratio of exports to imports decreased by 7.1 points to 86.9 %.

Chart 1: Monthly Foreign Trade (Billion Dollars)

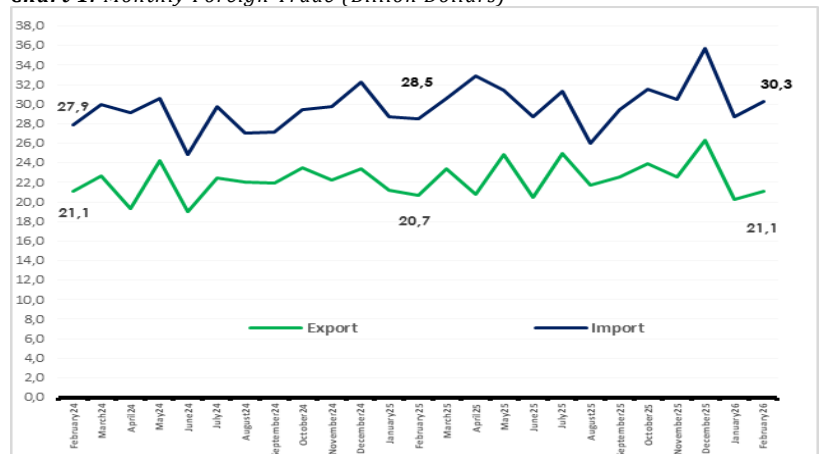


Chart 2: Export/Import Coverage Ratio

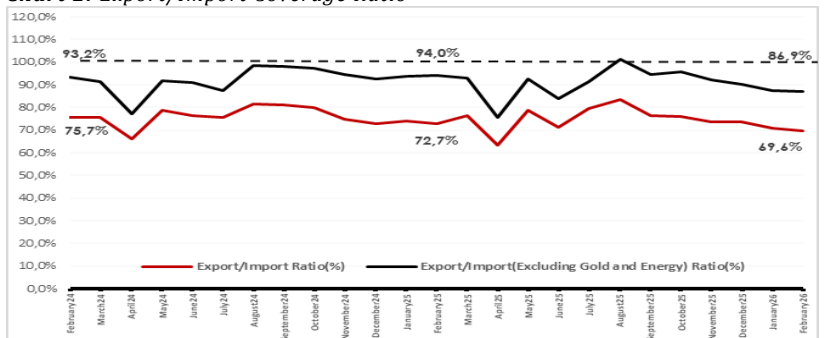
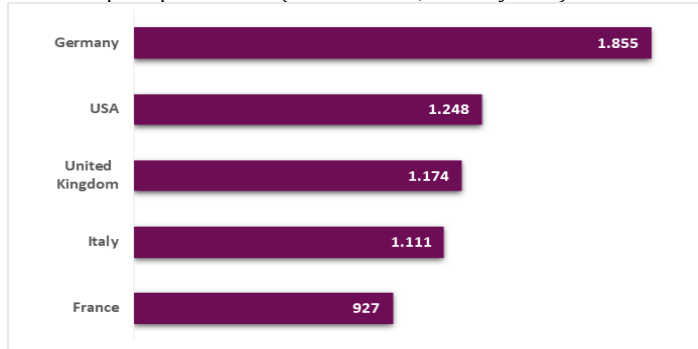
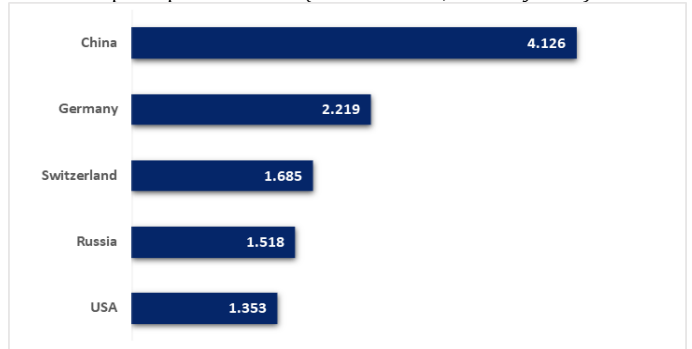


Chart 3: Top 5 Export Markets (Million Dollars, February 2026)



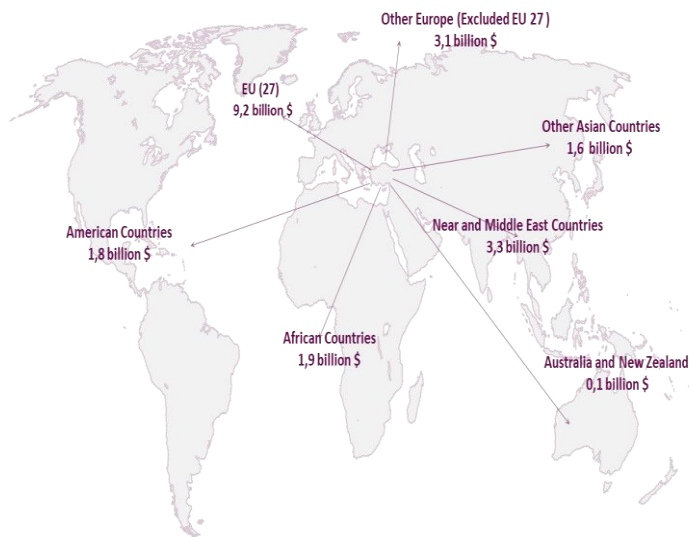
- The countries to which Türkiye exported the most in February are **Germany** (1 billion 855 million dollars), **USA** (1 billion 248 million dollars), and **United Kingdom** (1 billion 174 million dollars) respectively.
- In February, the share of the top 10 countries in total exports was 46.7%.

Chart 4: Top 5 Imported Sources (Million Dollars, February 2026)



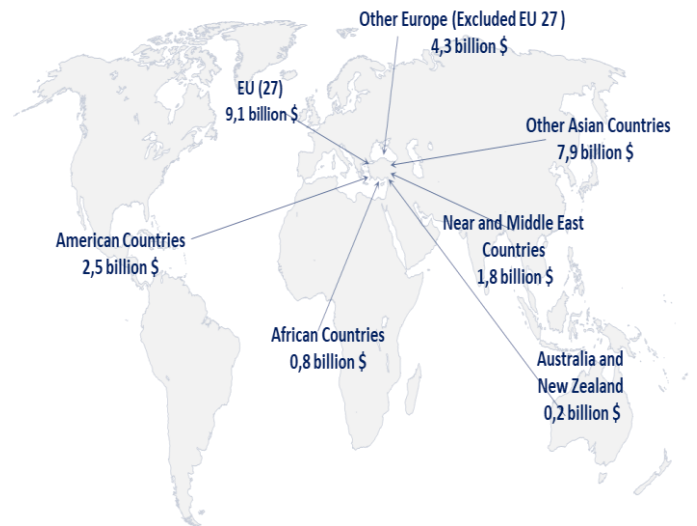
- The countries from which Türkiye imported the most in February are **China** (4 billion 126 million dollars), **Germany** (2 billion 219 million dollars), and **Switzerland** (1 billion 685 million dollars), respectively.
- The share of the top 10 countries in total imports was 50.8%.

- The country groups to which Türkiye **exported** the most in February are **European Union (EU-27)** (9 billion 244 million dollars), **the Near and Middle Eastern countries** (3 billion 270 million dollars), and **the other European countries** (3 billion 130 million dollars), respectively.

- The country groups from which Türkiye **imported** the most in February are **European Union (EU-27)** (9 billion 55 million dollars), **Asian countries** (7 billion 904 million dollars), and **the other European countries** (4 billion 284 million dollars), respectively.



Chart 7: BEC Classification of the Distribution of Export (February 2026)

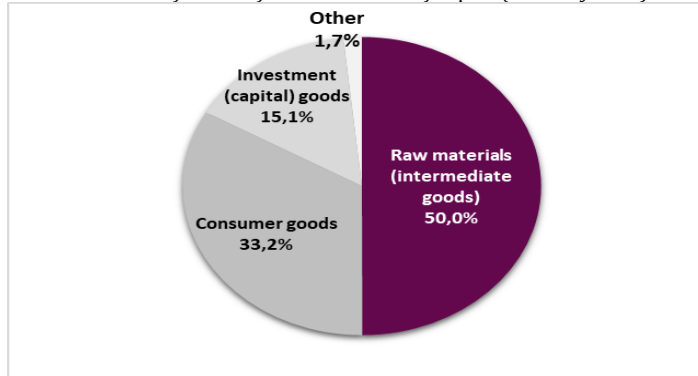
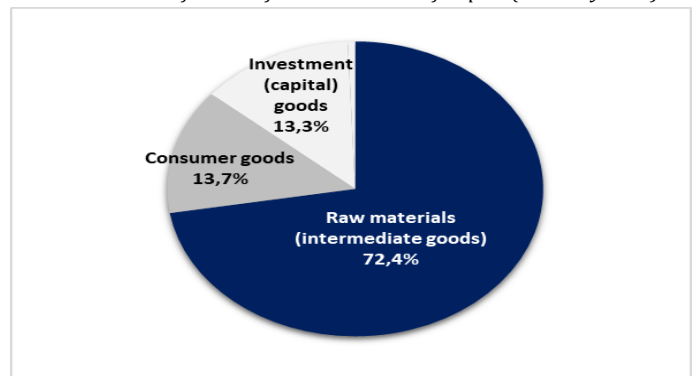


Chart 8: BEC Classification of the Distribution of Import (February 2026)



In February, top **exports** according to the BEC classification;

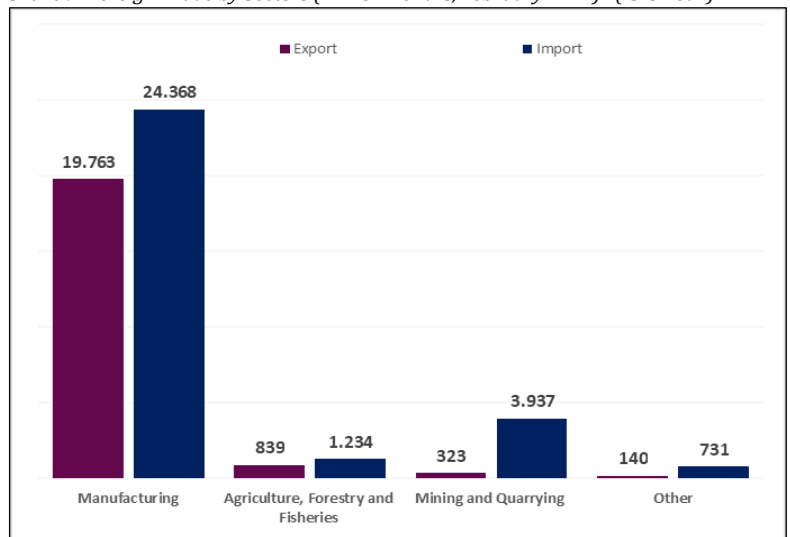
- "**Raw materials (intermediate goods)**" increased by 1.0% to 10 billion 526 million dollars,
- "**Consumer goods**" decreased by 6.7% to 7 billion 4 million dollars,
- "**Investment (capital) goods**" increased by 26.9% to 3 billion 185 million dollars.

In February, top **imports** according to the BEC classification;

- "**Raw materials (intermediate goods)**" increased by 5.6% to 21 billion 908 million dollars,
- "**Consumer goods**" decreased by 1.9% to 4 billion 160 million dollars.
- "**Investment (capital) goods**" increased by 15.7% to 4 billion 14 million dollars,

- The share of **exports** by sectors in February, respectively; the **manufacturing industry** was 93.8% (19 billion 763 million dollars), the **agriculture, forestry and fishing sector** was 4.0% (839 million dollars), the **mining and quarrying sector** was 1.5% (323 million dollars).
- The share of **imports** by sectors in February, respectively; the **manufacturing industry** was 80,5% (24 billion 368 million dollars), the **mining and quarrying sector** was 13.0% (3 billion 937 million dollars), the **agriculture, forestry and fisheries sector** was 4.1% (1 billion 234 million dollars).
