Türkiye's Exports Up 2.3% To \$24B in October, Hitting Record High

Country achieved its highest October exports and set a new record over last 12 months, says Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat



Türkiye's exports totaled \$24 billion, up 2.3% year-on-year in October, hitting a record high, the Turkish trade minister announced. In a news conference in Istanbul, Bolat said the country achieved its highest October exports and set a new record with exports reaching \$270.2 billion over the last 12 months, he explained. During the first 10 months of the year, the country's exports also amounted to \$224.6 billion, rising 3.9% year-on-year.

Türkiye's Industrial Sector Sees New Export Record For January-September

Türkiye's industrial sector records highest-ever exports for January–September period at \$143.2billion, up 5.7%, accounting for 71.4% of Türkiye's total exports



Türkiye's industrial sector achieved its highest-ever first-nine-month exports, totaling \$143.2 billion in January–September this year, according to data from the Türkiye Exporters' Assembly (TIM). Global agreements and sectoral trade meetings also contributed to the rise in exports.

Türkiye's total exports climbed 4.1% to \$200.6 billion in the first nine months of the year, the data showed. Industrial exports surged 5.7% accounting for 71.4% of total exports. Six of the 15 industrial sub-sectors broke export records during this period. The automotive industry's exports reached \$30.2 billion, followed by electrical and electronics with \$12.9 billion, jewelry with \$6.2 billion, defense and aerospace with \$6 billion, air conditioning with \$5.4 billion, and ships, yachts, and related services with \$1.5 billion. In terms of growth rates, defense and aerospace exports surged 39.3%, jewelry 14.3%, automotive 12.3%, ships, yachts, and services 8.7%, electrical and electronics 5.7%, and air conditioning 3.2%.

Germany was the top destination for Turkish automotive exports at \$4.9 billion, and also imported \$571.7 million in air conditioning products. Norway received \$264.6 million in shipbuilding and services exports, the UK imported \$1.3 billion in electrical and electronic goods, and the United Arab Emirates purchased \$2.3 billion in Turkish jewelry.

Türkiye, Jordan Ink Joint Economic Commission Deal

Türkiye-Jordan Joint Economic Commission involves many cooperation areas, ranging from trade to mutual investments



Türkiye and Jordan signed a memorandum of understanding at the Türkiye–Jordan Joint Economic Commission (JEC) meeting in Amman, with the participation of Turkish and Jordanian trade ministers. Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat said at the event that the JEC meeting marks a watershed moment in the two countries' bilateral relations in trade, investments, infrastructure, contracting, agriculture, health, culture, tourism, and other fields, with the signing of the first joint economic commission.

Bolat pointed out that during bilateral meetings, both the Turkish and Jordanian sides agreed to develop new projects and programs for cooperation in key areas. Turkish and Jordanian businesspeople, as well as the Foreign Economic Relations Board (DEIK), held a roundtable meeting as a part of Bolat's visit, while the business communities of the two countries will come together for a forum sometime in the future. "We will sign many agreements on cooperation in free zones, small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), organized industrial zones, standardization, education, health and scientific research, and agriculture," he said.

The Turkish-Jordan trade volume reached nearly \$1.5 billion between January and September, indicating rapidly growing trade relations based on a win-win approach, he added. He noted that Türkiye and Jordan, as well as their respective private sectors, support cooperating on the reconstruction of Syria, the Gaza Strip, and the West Bank. Bolat said the historic transportation corridor between Syria and Jordan would boost transport and trade from Europe to the Gulf via Türkiye, Syria, and Jordan, and then back to Europe.

Türkiye Inks 2 New Deals with Libya on Contracting, New-Era Projects

Both countries also agree to organize Türkiye-Libya Investment and Business Forum, hold 22nd meeting of Türkiye-Libya Joint Economic Commission in Tripoli in December



Türkiye and Libya signed two new memoranda of understanding (MoUs) on contracting receivables and new-era projects, the Turkish Trade Ministry announced. The deals were signed by Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat, and his Libyan counterpart Muhammad al-Huwayj and Libyan Transport Minister Muhammad Salem Al-Shahoubi on the sidelines of the 5th Türkiye-Africa Business and Economic Forum in Istanbul.


"The Memorandum of Understanding signed in the field of contracting is important for the follow-up of our contractors' receivables in Libya, as it is a continuation of the meeting between the delegations held in Ankara last September," the ministry said in a statement. It added that the deal marks the beginning of a new era for Turkish contractors to contribute to Libya's development by undertaking new projects. The ministers emphasized their mutual commitment to increasing trade with Libya, which reached \$3.7 billion by 2024, and to increasing Turkish contractors' business volume in the country. Sectors such as hydrocarbons, renewable energy, mining, customs, banking, and healthcare were considered potential areas for cooperation.

The statement said that the most important outcomes of the meeting were the decisions to organize the Türkiye-Libya Investment and Business Forum and to hold the 22nd meeting of the Türkiye-Libya Joint Economic Commission (KEK) in Tripoli on Dec. 16-17. The ministers also signed the Joint Declaration on the Establishment of the Joint Economic and Trade Commission (JETCO) and the minutes of the second meeting of the Türkiye-Libya Joint Working Group. "Both texts constitute a roadmap for subsequent work," the readout said.

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan and Qatar's Emir Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani witnessed the signing of several agreements between the two countries after they co-chaired the 11th Meeting of the High Strategic Committee in Doha.

Earlier, the two leaders met one-on-one and held inter-delegation talks at the Emir's Diwan. "Joint Declaration on the 11th Meeting of the High Strategic Committee between the Republic of Türkiye and the State of Qatar" was signed by Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan and Qatari Prime Minister and

Foreign Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani. "Memorandum of Understanding between the Presidency of Strategy and Budget of the Republic of Türkiye and the Government of the State of Qatar on Cooperation and Experience Sharing in Various Areas of Strategic Development Planning" was signed by Turkish Treasury and Finance Minister Mehmet Şimşek, Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat, and Secretary-General of Qatar's National Planning Council Abdulaziz bin Nasser Al Khalifa.

"Joint Ministerial Statement between the Ministry of Trade of the Republic of Türkiye and the Ministry of Commerce and Industry of the State of Qatar" was signed by Trade Minister Prof Dr. Ömer Bolat and Qatari Minister of Commerce and Industry Sheikh Faisal bin Thani Al Thani. "Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in the Field of Defense Industry" was signed by President of Türkiye's Defense Industry Agency Haluk Görgün and Qatari Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for Defense Affairs Sheikh Saud bin Abdulrahman bin Hassan bin Ali Al Thani.

The forum is being held this year under the theme "Leveraging Türkiye-Africa Relations for Mutual Gains."



FAO Food Price Index Down in September, Led by Dairy and Sugar

The FAO Food Price Index (FFPI) averaged 128.8 points in September 2025, down slightly from its revised August level of 129.7 points. Declines in the cereal, dairy, sugar, and vegetable oil indices outweighed an increase in the meat index. Overall, the FFPI was 4.2 points (3.4 percent) higher than in September 2024 but remained 31.4 points (19.6 percent) below its peak reached in March 2022.



The FAO Cereal Price Index averaged 105.0 points in September, down 0.6 points (0.6 percent) from August and 8.5 points (7.5 percent) below its September 2024 level. World wheat prices declined for the third consecutive month in September, largely due to subdued international demand and confirmation of large harvests in the Russian Federation and other key producing countries in Europe and Northern America. Maize prices also dropped, on forecasts of abundant supplies in exporting countries Brazil and the United States of America, while the temporary suspension of grain export taxes in Argentina also weighed on maize quotations. Among other coarse grains, world prices of both barley and sorghum rose, with barley prices recording a third consecutive monthly increase. Meanwhile, the FAO All Rice Price Index fell by 0.5 percent in September 2025 led by declines in Indica quotations, as ample exportable supplies and reduced purchase orders by buyers in the Philippines and Africa weighed on the market.

The FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index averaged 167.9 points in September, down 1.2 points (0.7 percent) from August but still 25.0 points (18.0 percent) above its year-earlier level. The decline mainly reflected lower palm and soybean oil quotations, more than offsetting increases in sunflower and rapeseed oil prices. International palm oil prices decreased slightly, largely due to higher-than-expected August stocks reported in Malaysia – reaching a 20-month high, offsetting the impact of strong global import demand. Global soyoil prices declined for the second consecutive month, pressured by elevated supplies from Argentina following temporary suspension of export taxes on soybeans and derived products in late September. By contrast, quotations of sunflower and rapeseed oils continued to increase, reflecting, respectively, lingering supply tightness in the Black Sea region and in Europe.

The FAO Meat Price Index averaged 127.8 points in September, up 0.9 points (0.7 percent) from its revised August level and 7.9 points (6.6 percent) from a year earlier, reaching a new record high. The increase reflected higher world bovine and ovine meat prices, while pig and poultry meat quotations

remained broadly stable. Bovine meat prices climbed to an all-time high, supported by strong demand in the United States of America, where limited domestic supplies and favourable price differential continued to encourage imports, especially from Australia, where prices rose. Brazilian bovine prices increased as well, underpinned by robust global demand, offsetting reduced access to the United States of America following the imposition of higher tariffs. World ovine meat quotations surged on the back of solid global import demand amid limited export availability from Oceania. Pig meat prices were steady, as firmer demand for Brazilian pig meat from alternative markets offset reduced purchases by China. In the European Union, the impact of new tariffs imposed by China on pig meat export prices remained limited. Poultry meat quotations remained firm, reflecting relatively balanced global markets, despite import restrictions related to localized outbreaks of high pathogenicity avian influenza.

The FAO Dairy Price Index averaged 148.3 points in September 2025, marking its third consecutive monthly decline, down 2.6 percent from August while remaining nearly 9 percent above its level a year earlier. All sub-indices eased, with butter falling by 7.0 percent, skim milk powder by 4.3 percent, and whole milk powder by 3.1 percent, while cheese quotations eased only slightly. The relatively sharp drop in butter prices reflected a seasonal increase in cream availability as demand for ice-cream in the Northern Hemisphere waned, alongside higher production expectations in New Zealand as the spring flush advances. Nevertheless, despite this fall, butter prices remained 6.3 percent above the 2024 average. Milk powder quotations decreased mainly on softer demand from key importers and firmer export competition. By contrast, cheese prices declined only marginally, as a modest easing in the European Union amid steady output and softer export interest was partly offset by firmer quotations in Oceania, where smaller early-season supplies and stronger demand from Asian buyers supported New Zealand prices.

The FAO Sugar Price Index averaged 99.4 points in September, down 4.2 points (4.1 percent) from August and as much as 26.9 points (21.3 percent) from a year ago, reaching its lowest level since March 2021 (96.2 points). The drop was driven by higher-than-expected sugar production in Brazil, resulting from large crushing volumes and increased use of sugarcane for sugar production in key southern growing regions. Additional downward pressure on prices came from favourable harvest prospects in India and Thailand, following ample monsoon rains, combined with expanded plantings.
